

HOW TO APPLY
STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

Beginning 12:01 a.m. on April 7:

- (1) Browse programs at: *stolaf.edu/international*, click “Search Programs”
or
Go to: *stolaf.studioabroad.com*
- (2) Create an application by clicking on the “Apply Now” button.
- (3) Complete the following steps:
 - Complete Application Questionnaires for each of the programs to which you are applying
 - Request approval signature electronically from your academic advisor
 - Pay a \$100 Application Fee
 - Complete the required signature documents.

If you are applying to more than one Interim, you need to complete the above steps, including the deposit, for each Interim.

If you are accepted to the program, the \$100 deposit will apply to the cost of the program. If you decline your acceptance to the program, you will forfeit the deposit. If you are not accepted to the program, your deposit is refunded.

PROGRAM COSTS

Program costs are charged in addition to regular St. Olaf tuition. The costs listed are estimates and include round-trip transportation from Minneapolis (except where indicated), prorating of instructor’s expenses, breakfast and one other meal per day, transportation for required study trips, entrance fees and tickets for scheduled group events, and accommodations, most often based on two and three persons sharing a room. Private baths are usually not provided.


Note: All costs listed are the most accurate estimates possible. They are subject to change due to airline costs, the rate of inflation and fluctuating rates of exchange. These factors might also necessitate the cancellation of a course if enrollment is not sufficient. If it is necessary to update costs, information will be provided in the fall.

Students on a full-board plan will receive a \$522 credit.

OVERVIEW

Each year, more than 800 St. Olaf students study on off-campus programs in Europe, Asia, the Middle East, Africa, North, South and Central America and the Pacific. Some programs extend the scope of particular majors, language concentrations or area studies; all add a cross-cultural dimension to a liberal arts education.

Most off-campus Interims are led by St. Olaf professors. Some programs are offered every year, others on an every other year basis.

A few programs listed in this brochure are not taught by St. Olaf faculty members but rather by another program provider that has been approved by St. Olaf faculty. These courses will count for a full St. Olaf Interim credit; they will fulfill major and general education credits as noted; they will appear on your transcript with a grade listed. But, since they are not taught by a St. Olaf faculty member, the grade received will not be computed into the St. Olaf GPA.
