Types of Programs


St. Olaf offers programs to meet every student's needs or interests. You can travel with a group or venture out as an individual. You can study in another language or in English. You can focus on one country or travel to several. You can choose one theme or take a variety of courses. Programs vary considerably in cost, structure, and the cultural opportunities they present. In addition to summer, semester, and year-long programs, St. Olaf offers around 30 January Interim programs (four weeks). A separate pamphlet released in the spring details the Interim offerings and the application process.

How to Apply

Students who wish to study off-campus in 2021–22 must complete an application no later than **February 15, 2021**. Some programs, as noted on the brochure, have an early deadline on **November 18, 2020**.

Applications will open on October 19, 2020. Follow these steps to find a program and apply:

- Find the program(s) to which you wish to apply.
- Review program information.





Eligibility

The opportunity to apply for an off-campus program is available to all St. Olaf College students. However, participation is not guaranteed to all students. A selection process, prerequisites and minimum requirements are in place for each program. Students on academic or disciplinary probation may apply to a program, although ordinarily a student who remains on probation may not participate in an off-campus program.

Program Costs


All students participating in St. Olaf College off-campus programs pay regular tuition and an additional fee for program costs. A detailed cost sheet is available at stolaf.studioabroad.com. St. Olaf students participating in St. Olaf off-campus programs are eligible to retain the financial aid they would receive while studying on campus, with the exception that work study is not available while a student is participating in an off-campus program. All applicants are automatically considered for a need based scholarship to help meet the additional costs associated with most off-campus programs. Students may consult financial aid office in determining estimated amount of aid.

Overview

Each year, about 800 St. Olaf students study on off-campus programs in Africa and the Middle East, Asia, Europe, North, South and Central America, and the Pacific. Some programs extend the scope of particular majors, language concentrations or area studies, but all add a cross-cultural dimension to a liberal arts education.

Seventy-five percent of St. Olaf students study off-campus at least once during their four years of study. According to the IIE Open Doors Annual Report on International Educational Exchange, St. Olaf regularly ranks #1 among baccalaureate institutions in the total number of students it sends abroad.

St. Olaf maintains an official approved list of nearly 60 semester or year-long programs. Students choose if they wish to carry financial aid with them and/or earn credits for general education. All off-campus programs are approved by a faculty curriculum committee and long-term programs are thoroughly reviewed every 8 to 10 years. Careful consideration is given to academic quality, safety factors, and cost.


