

AFFORDING STUDY ABROAD/AWAY

St. Olaf has \$1M+ in scholarship funding for study abroad/away. If you apply to study abroad/away, you will be **automatically** considered for scholarship funding.

Step 1: Estimate Extra Cost Above Being on Campus

Semester and Academic Year Example:

A semester program has an Extra Cost of \$4,500. The total program cost is \$11,000, but the \$6,500 cost of the on-campus housing/meal plan is subtracted from the program cost to arrive at the Extra Cost Above Being on Campus of \$4,500.

January Term Example:

A January Term program has a cost of \$6,300. The Extra Cost Above Being on Campus for this program is \$6,300 because there is no additional cost to taking a course on campus for January term.

Step 2: Estimate Level of Financial Need

	U.S. CITIZENS + PERMANENT RESIDENTS	INTERNATIONAL
HIGH	Students with a family income under \$75,000	Students receiving at least \$55,000 in grant/scholarship aid
MEDIUM	Students with a family income between \$75,000 and \$180,000	Students receiving between \$40,000 and \$55,000 in grant/scholarship aid
LOW	Students with a family income between \$180,000 and \$300,000	Students receiving between \$25,000 and \$40,000 in grant/scholarship aid

Step 3: Estimate % of Extra Costs Covered by Scholarship Funding

Semester/Year Programs

Pell Grant Recipients: **100%**
High Need International: **100%**
High Need (Not Pell Grant): **75-90%**
Medium Need: **50-70%**
Low Need: **25-40%**

January Term Programs

High Need: **40-50%**
Medium Need: **25-35%**
Low Need: **15-20%**
